From the Chaplain's Desk

"To the merciful You show yourself merciful..." Psalm 18:25

The Psalms are a wellspring of Christian living. They have the ability in one or two poetic lines to capture what might otherwise require pages and pages of prose. Such is the case with Psalm 18:25, a single line which encapsulates for us a deep spiritual principle about the world we're living in: You reap what you sow.

This is, I'm sure, not a new idea to any of us. The farming analogy is common in the Bible: The same way a farmer might be able reasonably to expect wheat to grow and not sunflowers if he plants wheat and not sunflowers, so we might reasonably expect God's mercy to grow upon us if we plant the seeds of mercy in our own actions. It's a natural process, just like the growing of a crop.

Paul gives us a good illustration of this principle, the mystery of our actions and God's grace working together to produce good spiritual fruit in our lives: "I (Paul) planted, Apollos watered, but God gives the growth." (1 Cor. 3:6.) God gives spiritual growth in response to our responding to him. Therefore we, who have been shown such incredible mercy at the hands of God, should be equally merciful to others, for if we are it shows we have been truly changed by mercy, and God's mercy will continue to grow upon us.

But the other side of the equation is also true: If we fail to show mercy to others (especially when we have the direct opportunity to) we will simultaneously be closing the door to God's mercy in our lives, inviting judgement by our own level of judgment. Let us instead use all we have and all we are to show mercy as we have been shown mercy to!
