


Merry Christmas and Happy Holidays from all the staff at Fernwood!

# CHAPLAINS DESK



### "And the angel came to her and said, 'Rejoice favoured woman! The Lord is with you." -Luke 1:28

When reading through Luke's Nativity story each Christmas, I'm always struck by how ordinary the people God chose for those extraordinary events were: Elderly Zechariah and Elizabeth, who were never able to have children; Mary, a young girl, and her workaday carpenter husband Joseph; Simeon, a senior in Jerusalem; and Anna, widowed for many a year. Real people, in a real place and time, facing real problems. Ordinary people. What binds them all together, and ushers them into the remarkable events of Christmas, is nothing extraordinary in and of themselves, but rather their faith-filled trust in an extraordinary God.

In each case the person involved had reasons to doubt or question the goodness and plan of God (infertility, poverty, widowed, waiting for a sign of hope but not seeing one) and yet every time their response was faith. I don't think that means they never questioned or doubted. But rather that in the really crucial moments they continually came back to a sort of dogged, dedicated, determined trust in the God they had always known, through good and bad. The remarkable reward for their longsuffering trust finds voice in Zechariah's song, "the Dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who live in darkness and the shadow of death, and to guide our feet into the way of peace!" (Lk. 1:68-79.)

The coming of Jesus at Christmas is a reminder to all those of us who are waiting, wanting, hoping-against-hope, that God is in fact good! He does not forget those who put their trust in Him but comes to each of us in His good time. We don't know when that will be. All that is ours is to continue trusting, believing that the extraordinary God of the Nativity is still God today, is still

Emmanuel; God with people like us!
