



Cheryl is returning to Fernwood with lots of great items to purchase!



FROM THE:

CHAPLAINS DESK



Psalm 96:10-13

"Then all the trees of the forest will shout for joy before the LORD for He is coming - He is coming to judge the earth!"

Words change over time and place. An ancient person might tell you that love is something in the bowels, whereas we today would say that the bowels are something quite different, and that love comes from the heart. The word 'wicked' is rarely used in it's older and truer meaning today (describing something which is morally evil or wrong), but rather as a slang term for something cool. And so on and so on. A similar sort of shift has happened with that great Biblical word, Judgement.

Often the word Judgement conjures up images of fire and brimstone, a grim scene full of fear and foreboding. But within that framework, passages like Psalm 96 become very difficult for us to understand. For here, the coming judgement of the LORD causes the fields and everything in them to exult, the trees to cheer, and the peoples of the earth rejoice! Why?

Because rightly understood, the judgement of the LORD is really about the setting right of all things. Of God bringing everything into the light of His perfect goodness and love to cast out what is evil so that what is good might be justified and set free forever. It is a freeing word. True, this might include some fear, for God's goodness must root out all darkness, which includes the darkness which exists in each of us. But at the end of the day, the remembrance of God's judgement should fill us with hope, just like it does the natural world. For, "He will judge the world with righteousness and the peoples with His faithfulness." On that day everything which is wrong will be made right, and we too will be set free from all the evil (internal and external) to enjoy the riches of His blessings forever. "Even so, come Lord Jesus!"(Rev. 22:20.)
