- 1 What is the oldest trophy to be awarded to a professional sports franchise?**

The Stanley Cup is the National Hockey League's trophy awarded annually to the playoff winner dating back to 1893.


- 2 What female athlete has won medals in both the summer & winter Olympics?**

Clara Hughes won two bronze medals in the 1996 Summer Olympics and 4 medals in 3 other Winter Olympics.


- 3 What famous Canadian traveled around the world in a wheelchair?**

Rick Hanson on his Man in Motion World Tour 1985-87. He raised over 26 million for spinal cord research.


- 4 Who is the first Canadian to win two of the National Basketball Association (NBA) award as MVP?**

Steve Nash, and is considered to be one of the greatest Canadian basketball players.


- 5 Which female athlete is the only Canadian to win an Olympic ladies single gold medal?**

Barbara Ann Scott in 1948. She was a 2-time World Champion and 4 - time Canadian national champion.


- 6 What are Canada's official sports?**

In 1994 the National Sports of Canada Act recognized lacrosse and ice hockey to be the national sports of Canada.


- 7 Who was the first to win the World Cup ski race in 1967?**

Nancy Greene. She won multiple races, including a gold medal at the Winter Olympics. The Nancy Greene Ski League helps youth across the country learn competitive skiing.


- 8 What two countries battled it out in the 1972 Summit Series??**

Canada and the Soviet Union.

Does Jesus care?

This question can come up in times of distress when it seems our prayers don't go very far. It's a question Mary and Martha likely asked as they waited for Jesus to come heal their brother (John 11). By the time Jesus came, though, Lazarus was in the grave.

Mary and Martha both said, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died."

That almost sounds like an accusation, like they're saying, "Where were you—don't you care?"

Jesus did care. He was "deeply moved in spirit and troubled" and he wept. Though his arrival seemed too late, Jesus knew what he was doing. It was through the miracle of Lazarus being raised from the dead that many came to faith in Christ.

Pastor Frank Graeff, also known as the Sunshine Minister for his optimistic attitude and sunny disposition, responds this way:

**Does Jesus care when my heart is pained
Too deeply for mirth or song,
As the burdens press, and the cares distress,
And the way grows weary and long?
Oh, yes, He cares, I know He cares,
