

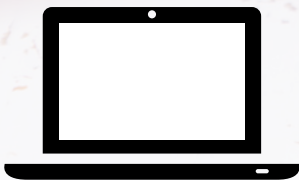

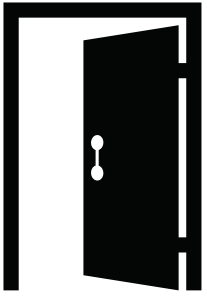

closed on Monday, May 23rd, 2022

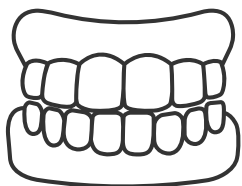

We are fortunate to have Joe Draude come in and play some 60's music for us on **Friday the 13th at 2pm**



CHAPLAINS DESK



“When he ascended on high, he made captivity itself a captive; he gave gifts to his people.” Psalm 68:18 / Ephesians 4:8

The ascension of Jesus into heaven is a great and glorious event in the Christian story. Forty days after the resurrection, Jesus returned to the right hand of the Father in heaven until “everything is put under his feet.” (1 Cor. 15:27.) There he remains, guiding and leading the universe, “working all things together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose.” (Rom. 8:28.) In addition to that wonderful consolation, the apostle Paul reads two more incredible blessings of the ascension out of Psalm 68: It takes captivity itself captive and bestows Christ’s gift of the Holy Spirit on his people.

First, making captivity a captive. Jesus is the “forerunner on our behalf,” the first human being to be raised from the dead and enter heaven. He opens the way there for us. In order to do that, however, we had to first be freed from our captivity. This is just what the letter to the Hebrews says happens in Jesus’ death and resurrection. “...So that through death he might destroy him who has the power of death (that is, the devil) and free those who all their lives were held in captivity by the fear of death.” (Heb. 2:14-15.) Jesus has destroyed the works of the devil and the power of death, taking those slave-masters captive and setting his people free.

The second great reality of the ascension is the giving of Christ’s gift of the Spirit to his people. This is what the Church will celebrate next month at Pentecost. Christ returned to heaven and then, as he promised, poured out his Spirit on the Church. (Galatians 4:4-6.)
