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CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

David prays an amazing prayer in Psalm 86. First, he asks for God to incline His ear to him and answer him (v. 1). Then he prays “Be gracious to me...” (v. 3), and “Make glad the soul of Thy servant...” (v. 4). And then he proclaims, “For Thou, Lord, art good, and ready to forgive, and abundant in loving kindness, to all who call upon Thee” (v. 5).

That was a victory thought for David. He was experiencing challenges in his life. Even his own son, Absalom, was threatening his life and kingdom.

Yet in all the pain, David had a confidence in God that kept him from denying Him.

David concludes with an affirmation of his God. He says: “There is no one like Thee among the gods, O Lord. Nor are there any works like Thine. All nations whom Thou hast made shall come and worship before Thee, O Lord; And they shall glorify Thy name”. For Thou art great and does wondrous deeds; Thou alone art God” (vs. 8-10). David had a confidence in his God, and nothing could nullify that trust and obedience to his God. In fact, David pleads with his God, “Teach me Thy way, O Lord; I will walk in Thy truth. Unite my heart to fear Thy name. I will give thanks to Thee, O Lord my God, with all my heart. And will glorify Thy name forever” (vs. 11-12). Even in old age, David still longed to know the will of God for his life.

And his desire was to walk and talk in that will.

Is that a picture of us? Do we, in our experiences of pain or discouragement, long for the quite presence of our Lord and his truth? A word of truth comes from David in Psalm 55:22, “Cast your burden upon the Lord, and He will sustain you; He will never allow the righteous to be shaken.” What a truth and comforting acknowledgement. Whether on a mountain top or in a deep valley, we can and should give praise to our God for His wonderful and loving care for us.

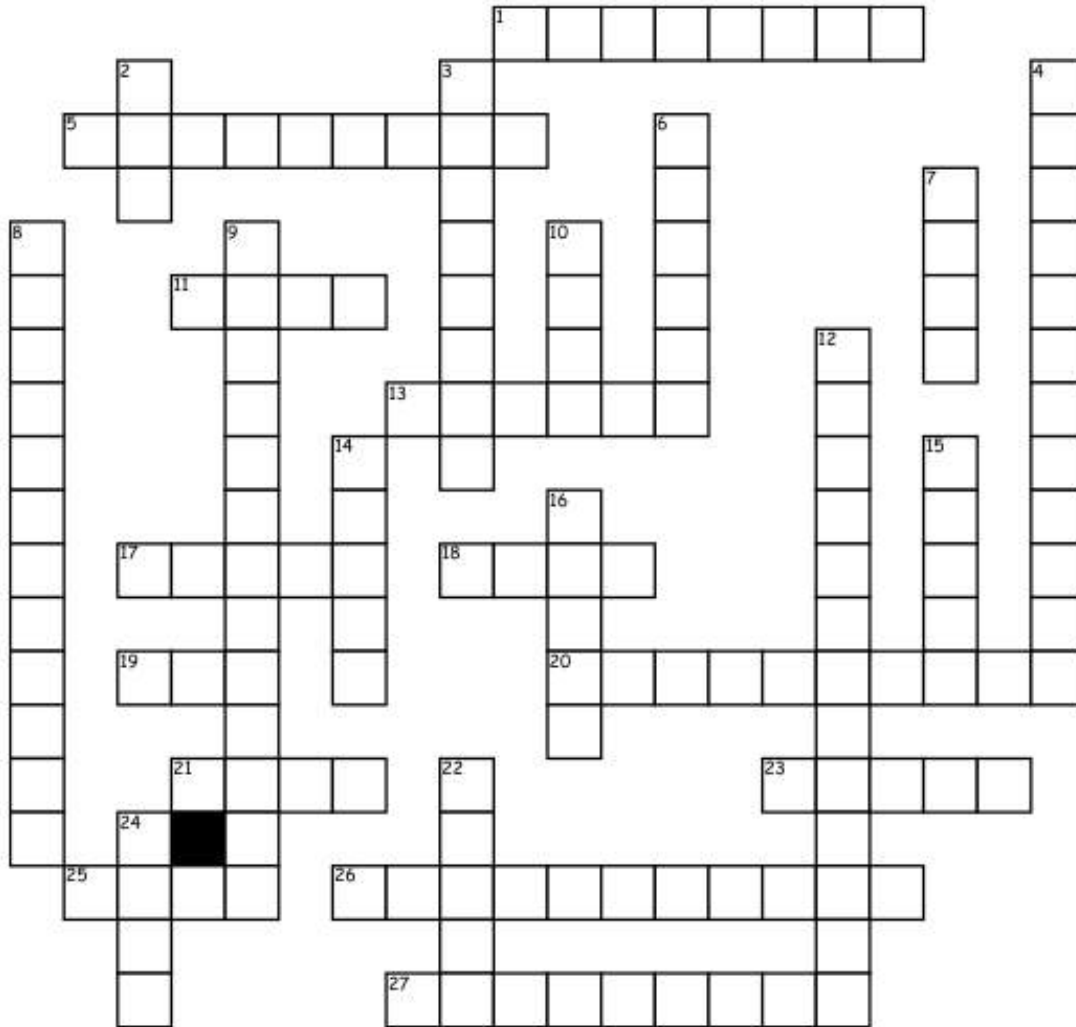
